



Paul Dibble

Born in 1943, Paul studied at Elam School of Fine Arts in Auckland.

In the 1970s Paul taught art in various secondary schools, before taking up a teaching position at Massey University in Palmerston North.

By the year 2000, Paul had left teaching and was working fulltime in his studio.

Paul's most famous public sculpture is the "Southern Stand: New Zealand Memorial", installed in 2006 at Hyde Park Corner in London.

Paul was awarded a New Zealand Order of Merit in 2004, and received an Honorary Doctorate from Massey University in 2007.

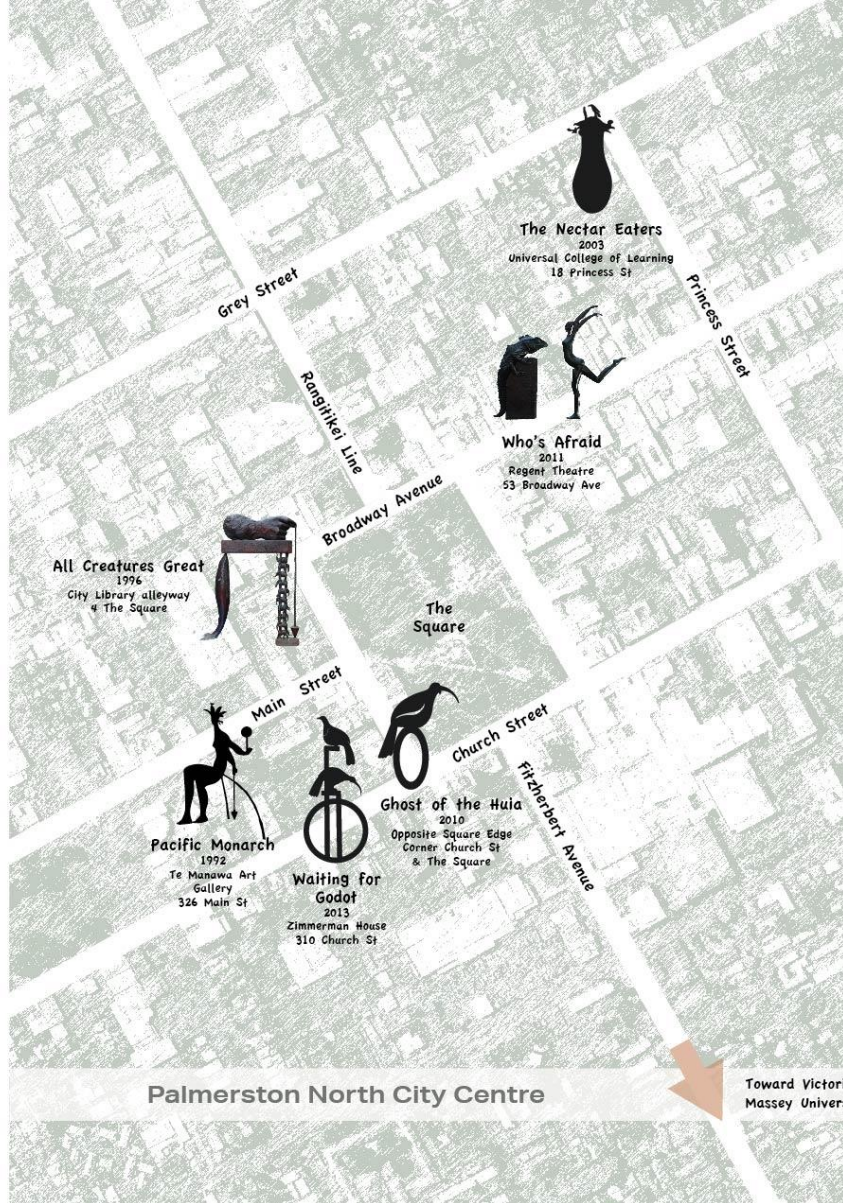

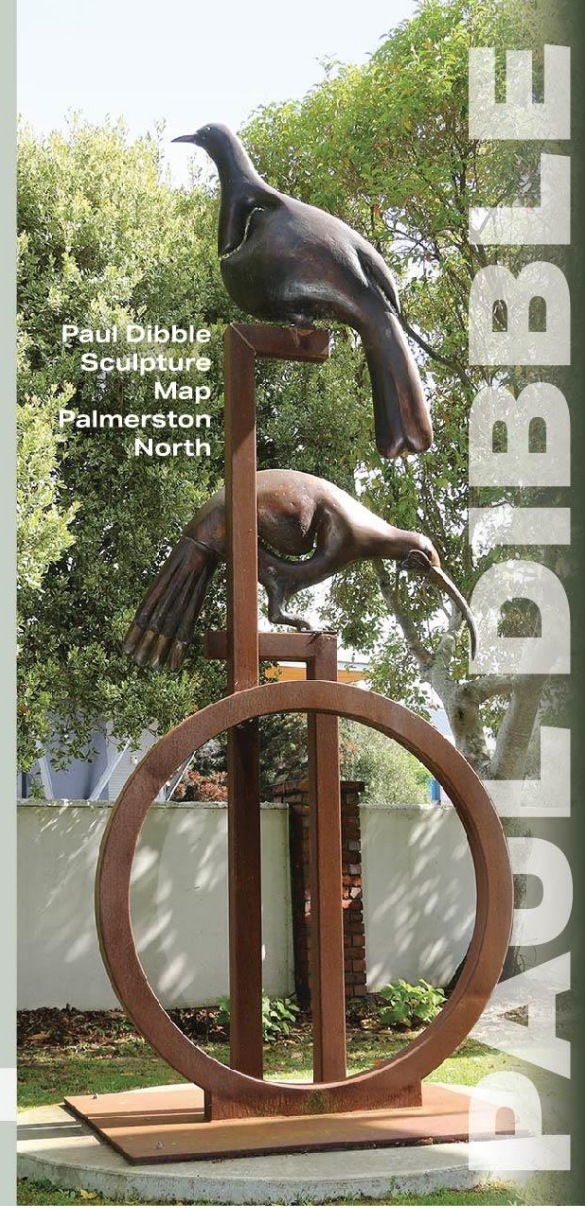
